

## Author guideline: case report

### What is a case report?

A case report delivers a report of a daily activity in the practice. Possible options are:

1. Clinical instruments
2. Interventions
3. Implementation of theory in the practice
4. Risk management
5. Administrative / educational processes
6. Classic case report

A case report contributes to increasing knowledge and usually describes a topic in the current literature that is not, or insufficiently described.

### Content

An article consists of a 3,500 words (excluding appendices and references).

The article should be provided bilingual, namely Dutch and English.

### Components

- Title: short, informative and inviting.
- Personal information: name, academic qualification and profession.
- Introduction: The introduction should give the context of the case report. The subject is motivated and also the main question is stated. The author provides a rationale why this case report is required.
- Case Description: a demographic description and a medical history.

### Layout

- Font: Tahoma 9 points.
- The text is aligned to the left, on a single line spacing.
- When abbreviations are used the first time, present both the spelled-out word and the short form.

### References

- APA or Vancouver method in the article and reference list
- Example APA: (Jansen et al., 2005)...
- Example Vancouver: in this study3-4...
- The reference list contains, author information, year of publication, volume, page numbers, title and journal.
- APA in alphabetical order and Vancouver method in sequence of use.
