

## **Author guideline: article**

### **What is an article?**

An article consists of a review or effect study with clinical relevance for physical therapy.

### **Content**

An article consists of a 3,500 words (excluding appendices and references).  
The article should be provided bilingual, namely Dutch and English.

### **Components**

- Title: short, informative and inviting.
- Personal information: name, academic qualification and profession.
- Article.
- IMRAD structure (Introduction, Methods, Results and Discussion).

### **Layout**

- Font: Tahoma 9 points.
- The text is aligned to the left, on a single line spacing.
- When abbreviations are used the first time, present both the spelled-out word and the short form.

### **References**

- APA or Vancouver method in the article and reference list.
- Example APA: (Jansen et al., 2005)...
- Example Vancouver: in this study3-4...
- The reference list contains: author information, year of publication, volume, page numbers, title and journal.
- APA in alphabetical order and Vancouver method in sequence of use.

### **Appendices**

- All tables will follow after the references as an appendix. There must be a clear reference of the tables in the text. Every table has a title, legend, and the abbreviations are explained.
